Getting there

Travel requirements

Travellers to Aruba are no longer required to purchase Aruba Visitors Insurance. All travellers must complete Aruba's Embarkation and Disembarkation Card before arrival, which is the country's digitised customs and immigration process.

Aircraft

Aruba is serviced by the Britsh Airways Boeing 777-200 aircraft. This is a long range, twin aisle and twin engine jet manufactured by Boeing, and is often referred to as the 'Triple Seven'.

Flight information

Fly to Aruba's Queen Beatrix International Airport (AUA), located in the island's capital city, Oranjestad from London Gatwick.

Total journey time: 11 hours 30 minutes including a short stopover in Antigua.

World Traveller




Club World

Discover Aruba


