Toronto is exactly five hours behind UK time.



The local currency is Canadian dollars and the exchange rate is around 1 GBP : 1.64 CAD.



There are approximately 200 different languages spoken in Toronto but English is the predominant language.

FLY WITH BRITISH AIRWAYS

Food

There isn't an awful lot of famous foods and dishes in Canada but Poutine is the most well known. This consists of fries, cheese curds and gravy. Other dishes include butter tarts and of course maple syrup!



Tipping

Tipping is generally expected in Canada when eating in restaurants and the usual amount for tipping in Toronto is 15%. For groups of six or more, 18% is added automatically.



Tax

When buying anything in Toronto, including food and drink, bear in mind that you have tax on top. This is 13% and the price you see on items is usually a pre tax price.
