

London Heathrow to Toronto Pearson International Airport (YYZ).

Home to one of the largest film festivals in the world, in addition to The Art Gallery of Ontario and Royal Ontario Museum, Toronto is the definition of a multicultural hub with a vibrant arts scene.

Preserved Victorian architecture, art galleries, artisan shops and breweries line the streets, making it a truly unique place that offers something for every type of traveller, and its dynamic core of soaring skyscrapers a magnificent sight to behold.



Food

Travellers should head to the infamous neighbourhoods of Chinatown, Little Italy, Kensington Market, and Greektown for a selection of diverse cuisines, whilst the historic Lawrence Market boasts a wide range of local and international offerings, including the famous peameal bacon sandwich.

Upscale restaurants like Alo and Canoe also bring modern twists to Canadian and international dishes.



Sightseeing

The CN tower, one of the tallest freestanding structures in the world, showcases breathtaking panoramic views of the city, as well as an exhilarating EdgeWalk structure for the thrill seekers!

A short ferry ride from downtown, you'll find the peaceful Toronto Islands with beaches, trails and views of the city skyline; alternatively, Casa Loma, a gothic revival-style mansion gives visitors a peek into Toronto's past with gardens and medieval architecture.







Vancouver is a real hub of talent and self-expression, with dance, theatre and music everywhere you go. Theatre here thrives with its rich offerings and iconic events, while the music scene is a testament to the city's diverse and vibrant tastes.

The Museum of Anthropology at UBC celebrates Indigenous art and history, with artifacts and cultural stories from the region's First Nations people, and the Vancouver Art Gallery focuses on West Coast artists and environmental themes, making it a dynamic space for art lovers.



Food

Vancouver explodes with flavour during Dine Out Vancouver, a three-week celebration of the city's exceptional culinary scene. Nearly 400 restaurants, from MICHELIN guide establishments to cosy neighbourhood eateries offer special fixed-priced menus for visitors to enjoy.

There are also a plethora of food tours and vibrant festivals that offer a passport to worlds of culinary exploration, with everything to offer from fresh seafood to Asian dishes, here travellers can seize the chance to engage with food lover and chefs alike.



Sightseeing

Be at one with nature at the Capilano Suspension Bridge Park, where you can take in stunning vistas from three different perspectives. The 450 ft long, 230 ft high bridge has thrilled visitors since 1889, offering an all-encompassing experience with everything from nature talks to stairs and platforms that run through rainforest vegetation.

Travellers won't have to go far to find majestic wildlife, with Grouse Mountain, The Peak of Vancouver on their doorstep. Here, they can pay a visit to the Grizzly Bear Habitat to see their resident bears, Grinder and Coola, learn more about their owl ambassadors or enjoy a delicious meal with spectacular views.







Culture

Made unique by its French-Canadian Heritage and named as the first UNESCO City of Design in North America, Montreal is nothing short of impressive. From its preserved charm apparent in its cobblestoned streets, historic building and the beautiful Notre-Dame Basilica, it's culture and arts scene is a major draw for travellers year on year.

Known as the city of festivals, Montreal hosts events such as the Montreal Jazz Festival, Just for Laughs comedy festival and MUTEK for electronic music, ideal for those looking to immerse themselves in the vibrant entertainment scene.



Montreal is famous for its poutine, a dish that involves fries with cheese curds, gravy and Montreal-style bagels, which are slightly sweeter and denser than New York bagels, however French-inspired bistros like are also in abundance and each offer their own unique dining experience.

The Jean-Talon Market and Atwater Market are also great for sampling Quebecois cheese, fresh produce, and gourmet treats.



Sightseeing

Mount Royal, a natural landmark, offers beautiful panoramic views of the city, hiking trails, and peaceful spots for picnics and birdwatching; in winter it transforms into a vibrant hive of activity for winter sports such as skiing and snowboarding.

Visitors can wander through Old Montreal with its 17th-century architecture, boutiques, galleries, and scenic spots like Place Jacques-Cartier, or for something more modern, visit the Biodome and Botanical Garden, where ecosystems from the Amazon to the Arctic can be enjoyed.
