

# British Airways return to *Bangkok*

Reconnect with the vibrant heart of Thailand as British Airways launch their new route from London Gatwick to Bangkok. Starting from 28 October 2024, flights will initially operate three times per week.

Beginning on 10 January 2025, an additional weekly service will be added, increasing the frequency to four flights per week until the end of the Winter 2024 season. Then, from 12 January until 24 February 2025, a second additional service will be introduced, resulting in five flights per week. Finally, from 30 March until 26 April 2025, flights will return to operating three times per week.

## Bangkok

-  London Heathrow to Suvarnabhumi Airport (BKK)
-  Approximately 11 hours 55 minutes
-  Metro and Skytrain are great ways to avoid traffic jams
-  Distance from London: 5,919 miles

## Phuket

-  London Heathrow to Phuket International Airport (HKT)
-  Approximately 14 hours 30 minutes
-  Use taxis or tuk-tuks, or you can also hire cars or motorcycles
-  Distance from London: 6,151 miles






# Bangkok

## Attractions

# Phuket

## Attractions

Patong Beach is the island's most famous, but for a quieter experience, head to Kata or Karon beaches. Visitors can also explore the nearby Phi Phi Islands or take a boat tour to Phang Nga Bay, known for its limestone cliffs and emerald-green waters.

## Food

# Chiang Mai

# Krabi

## Attractions

## Attractions


