Antigua is all about the coast, with 365 beaches—one for each day of the year—ranging from secluded coves to lively beach bars. The historic Nelson's Dockyard, once a British Royal Navy base, now attracts world-class yachts, establishing Antigua as the Caribbean's top sailing hub. This maritime charm has brought fantastic dining spots, like Catherine's Cafe Plage, famous for its fresh steamed fish.

To explore the island, you can take a taxi, rent a car, or hop on a boat. The east coast features Green Island, a private islet with pristine coves and vibrant snorkelling spots. On Sunday afternoons, head to Shirley Heights, a restored military lookout, for a lively party with jerk barbecue, rum punch, and live music, all set against a stunning sunset over English Harbour.

With excellent long-haul flight connections, Antigua is also the perfect starting point for island-hopping across the Caribbean.









Barbados, a favourite among the rich and famous, has seen significant investment, boosting its dining scene to unmatched heights in the Caribbean. While the island is more commercialised, it still offers peaceful villages and picturesque sugar cane fields. The beaches are lively but maintain a relaxed, quintessentially Caribbean vibe.

The island boasts everything from Michelin-star quality dining to fresh fish served at laid-back cafés. Each Friday evening, local stalls serve up freshly fried fish with live music, making for a fun, local dining experience.

Barbados also offers abundant water sports, and inland attractions include the Andromeda Botanical Gardens and Saint Nicholas Abbey, a historic plantation house. Among the island's top stays is the Sandpiper, a family-owned gem with intuitive service and a serene beach setting.

Also good to know: Barbados's undeveloped east coast features the Atlantis Hotel perched on a clifftop with breathtaking views. This rugged coastline is perfect for hiking and discovering secluded coves.







Grenada

Grenada, the Caribbean's spice island, boasts rich soil that supports thriving nutmeg, cocoa, and sugar plantations, along with lush green jungles. Its pristine white-sand beaches are never crowded and lead into crystal-clear waters ideal for swimming and snorkelling.

Grenada is perfect for independent travellers as they can catch a local bus and explore the island's cocoa plantations, rum distilleries, waterfalls, and rainforest trails at their own pace. St. George's offers a delightful way to spend a leisurely afternoon, with its pastel-coloured churches and wooden homes.

Regular flights connect Grenada with Antigua, Saint Lucia, and Barbados, perfect for the ultimate Caribbean getaway.









Saint Lucia's iconic twin Pitons, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, dominate the south of the island with stunning jungle trails. In the north, you'll find golden beaches, swaying palms, and the lively resort town of Rodney Bay.

With a history of changing hands between the French and British, Saint Lucia blends British architecture, French cuisine, African art, and a relaxed vibe.

For hiking, the Tet Paul Nature Trail offers spectacular views of the Pitons and Mount Gimie. Near the Pitons, Ladera provides unbeatable views from its open-air rooms. Hotel Chocolat's estate nearby features a unique restaurant with chocolate-infused dishes.

For a coastal escape, Cap Maison's Spanish-style villas overlook a secluded beach and offer excellent on-site dining. Also, diving at Petit Piton is remarkable, with its cliff face covered in soft corals and sea whips.









Saint Kitts and Nevis, historically the heart of the Caribbean, were key to the region's sugar industry. Colonised by the British and contested by the Spanish and French, these small islands have left a lasting mark on Caribbean history.

After the sugar industry's decline, the islands faded from the spotlight. Today, former plantations are now charming boutique hotels, while the islands retain a tranquil village atmosphere.

Beyond the beautiful beaches—ranging from volcanic black-sand coves to golden stretches—there's much to explore. Visit 19th-century fortifications, ride the Caribbean's only original narrow-gauge railway, and see where Admiral Nelson wed.

On Saint Kitts, renting a car is ideal for exploring, with Brimstone Hill Fortress being a must-see. Nevis, with its single road circling the island, is best explored by bike with a guide to uncover its rich history. Nevis also offers excellent hiking, including a challenging trail to Nevis Peak and the Botanical Gardens, which attract rare birds and butterflies.









Tobago, the smaller of the twin-island nation of Trinidad and Tobago, is a Caribbean gem known for its unspoiled beauty and relaxed vibe. The island boasts pristine white-sand beaches, lush rainforests, and a vibrant coral reef, making it a paradise for nature lovers and beachgoers alike.

For adventure seekers, Tobago offers fantastic snorkelling and diving opportunities, with the Buccoo Reef and the Nylon Pool being standout spots. The island's diverse landscapes include the lush Tobago Forest Reserve, which is perfect for hiking and birdwatching.

Exploring Tobago's charming towns, such as Scarborough and Castara, reveals local culture and history. The island's rich heritage is reflected in its colourful markets, colonial architecture, and lively festivals.

Tobago is easily accessible with regular flights from Trinidad, and it's well worth combining with a visit to its vibrant sister island, Trinidad, for a fuller Caribbean experience.


